The Vedic Red

North Indian Weddings

A North Indian union is anchored by the sacred fire, the Agni that witnesses every vow. From the heavy chime of Temple Bells to the cooling touch of Silver & Rose Quartz Bowls, we curate the elemental details of a Vedic ceremony.



Panch-Dhatu Havan Kund

A sacred anchor for the Eternal Agni, hand-cast in five traditional metals. This vessel is designed to hold the holy fire, serving as the elemental witness to your first vows.

Rose Quartz Shagun Bowls

Silver-etched vessels anchored by raw Rose Quartz, designed for the intimate rituals of hospitality. Whether holding sacred offerings or premium dry fruits, these bowls turn the act of Shagun into a luminous heritage statement.





The Maratha Silk

Maharashtrian Weddings

From the hand-woven gold of a Paithani Saree to the architectural grace of a Swayambar backdrop, we translate the noble strength of Maratha heritage for the modern aisle.



Auspicious Mung-Ganesh Favors

Mung beans represent Prosperity and New Growth. Placing a hand-cast Ganesha on a bed of Mung is a way of ensuring the couple's first "harvest" together is blessed and plentiful.

The Gota Tassel Thali

A rhythmic, high-energy tray designed for the Haldi. The heavy tassels aren't just decor; they represent the "movement and music" inherent in all celebrations.





The Marwari Glimmer

Rajasthani Weddings

From hand-painted Phad backdrops to the artisanal detail of a Mirror work, we translate the palatial splendor of Rajasthan for the modern aisle. We source the rare, storied elements that turn your royal heritage into a luminous, living masterpiece.



The Mangodi Mat

A tribute to the communal ritual of sun-drying lentils. By adding Gota, we turn a humble chore of "providing" into a celebrated stage for family abundance.

The Thikri-Mirror Work Suit

Inspired by palace walls, these hand-set glass fragments are designed to catch "The Glimmer," turning the bride into a living reflection of the palace itself.





The Bandhani Pulse

Gujarati Weddings

From hand-etched Kankupagla Trays to the rhythmic beauty of Bandhani textiles, we weave the vibrant spirit of your heritage into the modern ceremony. We source the tactile details that bring the heartbeat of your culture to life.

The Kankupagla Tray

The Kankupagla tray holds the vermilion (Kanku) that stains the bride's feet, leaving a trail of red footprints as she enters. It is a symbol of Goddess Lakshmi arriving, bringing luck, grace, and a permanent legacy of love to the household.



Peacock Trousseau Display

The peacock is a sentinel of protection. Its "thousand eyes" act as watchful guardians, shielding a bride's heirlooms from negativity. This velvet display turns jewelry organization into a "Plumage of Protection" for the treasures she carries into her new home.





The Altar White

Christian Ceremonies

From hand-embroidered Lace Veils to silk-lined Mirror-work Textiles, we weave the serene grace of the Altar White into your ceremony. We source the delicate, artisanal details that turn your walk down the aisle into a timeless legacy.



The Mantilla Veil

A "Sacred Screen" of corded lace. It exists to catch the filtered church light, creating a translucent halo that protects the bride during her walk to the altar.

The Minnu

A leaf-shaped pendant etched with seven beads. It represents the Tree of Life, signifying that the marriage is anchored in spiritual growth and ancestral roots.





The Noor-e-Nikah

The Nikah Ceremony

We bring the Tehzeeb of a Nikah to life through curated, heritage details. From hand-calligraphed contracts to gold-threaded Pearl Potlis, we ensure your ceremony feels both sacred and sophisticated.



Seed Pearl Bridal Potli

In Islamic tradition, pearls represent Heavenly Beauty. This bag isn't just for essentials; it's a tactile piece of "Noor" (light) that the bride carries as she transitions into her new life.

The Sacred Nikahnama

The contract is the "Soul of the Union." We treat it as an archival document because it is the physical evidence of a spiritual agreement, a piece of history to be framed, not filed away.





The Dravidian Gold

Kerala Weddings

The beauty of a Kerala union lies in its quietude, the cream-and-gold of a Kasavu and the sacred clarity of a Valkannadi. We curate the minimalist, high-craft elements that bring the serene spirit of the backwaters to your ceremony, honoring a heritage of grace.



Sholapith Hair Installation

Flowers wilt, but Sholapith is "Eternal Flora." It was created for the gods because it remains pristine and white, representing a devotion that never fades.

The Silver Panchapatra Set

A vessel for sacred water. It exists to make the "intimate precision" of the ritual feel precious. The silver acts as a purifier, ensuring the offerings are as clean as the intent.





The Khalsa Glow

Sikh Weddings

From sourcing hand-crafted Ornate Kalire to the finest Mustard-Embroidered Silks, we ensure your Amritsar inspired ceremony carries the authentic weight and golden warmth of the Khalsa spirit.



The Heritage Kirpan

A symbol of Honor and Protection. The groom carries it not as a weapon, but as a reminder of his duty to protect the sanctity of his new home and carry on his heritage.

Bridal Chooda and Kalire

The Chooda bangles are the first sacred signal of the bride's new life, while the Kalire chimes are family blessings, designed to ensure she carries the prosperity of her childhood home into her new beginning.

Nazar Thali

A wedding is a peak moment of beauty and vulnerability. This Guardian Thali combines the sacred Lotus with Nazar amulets, creating a spiritual sentinel that shields your most precious offerings, from the envy of the world.



Topor & Mukut Set

According to legend, Lord Shiva requested a crown of weightless, milky-white pith for his own wedding. These Sholapith crowns carry that "Elemental Purity", turning ancient Bengali folklore into wearable architecture that feels as light as a feather.
